

Canal Walk Series Begins April 24

Join local experts for informative walks through the Augusta Canal National Heritage Area. Topics include native trees and plants, a late-spring bird walk and a look at the 19th Century engineering feats that created the Canal. Walks will be Saturday mornings at 10 and Sunday afternoon at 3 and last from one to two hours. The Saturday program repeats on Sunday. Walks will start at the Raw Water pumping station or Bulkhead gate. \$2 adult/\$1 child with an \$8 maximum per family group.
